## The American Friends of Jamaica Grant 16 Local Organizations Aid

The American Friends of Jamaica announced recently that it is providing grants totaling US\$ 566,765.45 (J\$ 37.0 million) to 16 local charities. The presentations were made Friday April 28 at a luncheon at the Kingston residence of United States Ambassador Brenda LaGrange Johnson. The gathering included AFJ donors, Jamaican businesspersons, diplomats and AFJ grantee representatives.

Ambassador Johnson is pleased to support this year's event, "The work of the AFJ is

extremely important for encouraging private sector philanthropy in Jamaica", said Amb. Johnson, "The AFJ have clearly shown the enormous potential of public-private partnerships to assist in development".

The American Friends of Jamaica this year celebrates 25 years of supporting Jamaican charities. Amb. Glen Holden, AFJ's President for over 11 years added, "Our contributions have made a difference in the sustainability of many organizations and their suc-

cess in serving the Jamaican people stresses the importance of our work"

With the increasing importance of philanthropy and the active engagement of civil society for the social sector, the grants distributed this year will reach a diverse group of organizations across the education, healthcare and economic development sectors. Projects range from patient assistance, medical equipment, literacy programs, and skills develop-

## \$102 Million for Tourism Product Development

Sums totalling more than J\$102.6 million have been allocated to the Ministry of Tourism, Entertainment and Culture for the tourism product development and services portfolio.

This is contained in the 2006/07 Estimates of Expenditure, now before the House of Representatives.

Of this amount, the Tourism Product Development Company (TPDCo) has been allocated more than J\$77.5 million for training, beautification projects, property maintenance, the visitor information programme and sustainable environmental and tourism projects.

The J\$3 million grant allocated to training will facilitate the hosting of seminars in areas such as customer service, tour guiding skills, heritage tourism, life saving skills, foreign languages, private security training and

workplace literacy.

The sum of J\$20 million allotted to beautification projects will be used primarily to improve the environment and physical attractiveness of the main resort areas. A major focus of this activity will be the implementation of beautification projects in Kingston and on the South Coast.

More than J\$20.70 million was granted for the maintenance of properties, which were formerly owned by the Jamaica Attraction and Development Company (JADCo) and the Recreational Development Company (RDC). The Tourism Product Development Company is now in charge of these properties.

Meanwhile, some J\$13.83 million was granted to the Visitor Information Programme. The main thrust of this programme, is the provision of visitor information

services.

Sustainable Environmental and Tourism Projects benefited from a J\$20 million grant, which will be used for the sustained development and improvement of the environment in the major resort towns, to facilitate upgrade and beautification works in these areas.

In the meanwhile, the Jamaica Reservation Services (JRS) received more than J\$25 million for use in direction and administration. The JRS provides telesales to the Jamaica Tourist Board and provides marketing support for hotels, villas, attractions and other products in the sector, with special emphasis on the integration of business entities that offer support services to the sector.

In addition, the JRS seeks opportunities to promote and market entertainment events as a part of the tourism prod-

## Jamaica's true colors: red, green and golf

Jamaica is blessed with all the qualities of a world-class golf destination. In addition to excellent year-round weather, the topography, lush vegetation and scenic beauty of our tropical island also encourages creative golf course designs by imaginative golf course architects. Jamaica is also famous for its caddies: lively, entertaining, experienced, dedicated - with an uncanny ability to track down

shots. Fairways are separated by tall, frilly Australian pines, as well as flowering hibiscus and bough.

### Half Moon

Designed by the renowned Robert Trent Jones Sr., the course opened in 1961 and since has firmly established itself as one of prized courses that the Caribbean has to offer. Measuring a massive, 7,119 yards from the back

### Cinnamon Hill

One instinctively marvels at the parcel of land on which Robert von Hagge-designed Cinnamon Hill GC (formerly Three Palms) at the Rose Hall Resort and Country Club. On an island blessed with lushness and topographical character, and short on acreage, the layout moves from an open, windswept front nine into the lower elevations of the Blue Mountains on the back nine, where dense foliage traps the fairways of the incoming holes. Boasting interesting, serene, descriptive and sometimes downright intimidating names each hole has its own intriguing characteristics and is sure to leave behind a memorable experience. The surrounding scenery at #15 "Mountain Falls" is so striking, that a scene was shot here for the James Bond film Live and Let Die. The course is built on what was once a 400-acre plan-

tation, and remnants of the area's history, including aqueducts, gravestones, and ruins of historic homes, offer a crumbling reminder of a land that once breathed a life of its own, long before golf.

### White Witch

Locals are quick to say that Annie Palmer still haunts the Rose Hall Great House and the estate- including the course built there on the grounds. The White Witch Course, designed by the team of Robert Von Hagge, Rick Baril and Mike Smelek, opened in August 2000 as the centerpiece of the new Ritz Carlton Rose Hall Resort. Instead of traditional tropical terrain, the layout is mountainous and rugged. The 6,718-yard course sticks to the high ground where there are cool breezes and ocean views on 16 holes. This elevated route can be intimidating, with its carries over jungle-like terrain, but the course intertwines with the mountains and provides golfers with some of the best views of the coastline.

### Cable & Wireless National Golf Academy

Kingston's bustling business and entertainment hub, New Kingston, is also fast becoming the capital city's recreational sporting center thanks in part to the addition of Cable and Wireless' National Golf Academy. Located on lands with a view of New Kingston's towering buildings and the distant Blue Mountains, the National Golf Academy is the island's first public driving range and putting green. Spanning an impressive 240 yards, the driving range plays like a real golf course with undulating fairways, 6 manicured greens and well-placed holes, bunkers and ponds. From the Academy's 23 bays you may practice your swing and drive, or on the adjacent putting green, you can hone your short game skills.

wayward shots and to read the breaks on even the trickiest greens. We invite you to play our courses for yourself for an unforgettable golfing experience:

Montego Bay is the island's golf capital boasting five championship golf courses, premium hotel accommodations, an international airport served by several major airlines, beaches and other recreational, shopping and entertainment facilities.

### SuperClubs Ironshore

The former Ironshore Golf & Country Club is a links-style, par-72 course. Once referred to as Jamaica's gem in the rough, it's a demanding course with plenty of doglegs and bunkers to challenge your A-game. Since January 2000, SuperClubs has been polishing that gem. A beautifully decorated new clubhouse was built and a massive course renovation completed. The greens are in their best condition in 20 years, locals say. The 6,570-yard layout delivers what is expected - an entertaining golf experience, with several water encounters and a number of interesting blind

### Tryall

Tryall's 18-hole, Ralph Plummer-designed championship course has played host to such prestigious international events as the Johnnie Walker World Championship, last won by Fred Couples in 1995. With holes that kiss the shoreline and flirt with the edges of jungle ravines, it is probably the most celebrated golf course in the Caribbean. The course stretches 6,772 yards from the ocean-side up into forested hills, past coconut groves, and back down to the sea along a route lined with flowering plants and magnificent trees. The signature par-three 4th hole incorporates the natural challenges of the Caribbean Sea and the Flint River, while the memorable par-four 7th hole provides a dramatic tee-shot through the stone pillars of the historic aqueduct that feeds the adjacent waterwheel.

## New Features for Calabash 2006

Calabash International Literary Festival returns for its annual staging next month, and festival founder, Colin Channer, promises that this year's event, while having much of its original flavour, will appeal to a more diverse audience.

"It is going to present many of the things that people like, and we are going to be doing some new things. It is going to be earthy, inspirational, daring and diverse," he told JIS News at the media launch of the event which was held in picturesque Strawberry Hill on April 19.

Among the new features of the three-day event, which will be held from May 26 to May 28 in Treasure Beach, St. Elizabeth, is an onstage conversation with British author, Geoff Dyer, while on opening night, actor Delroy Lindo, will read from Calabash's anthology 'Iron Balloons: Hit Fiction From Jamaica's Calabash Writer's Workshop.'

"There is nothing like hearing an actor read a story because all

the nuances of voice and subtleties of body language come into play. He is one of the most respected actors in Hollywood, on the Broadway stage and London's West End, so it is going to be one of those small changes that make a big difference," Mr. Channer said.

In addition, he told JIS News that he and co-organiser, Kwame Dawes, had made a conscious decision to include more women authors and performers on the festival bill this year.

Among the females scheduled to appear are United States-based authors and poets, Sonia Sanchez, Cathleen Falsani, Lolita Hernandez, Suheir Muhammad, Margi Jefferson and Ishle Park; Diana Evans from Great Britain; Cheryl Boyce-Taylor from Trinidad; and Tanya Stephens, Emily Crooks and Lorna Goodison from Jamaica.

As for male representation, Mr. Channer informed that these would include Jamaicans Marlon James, Wayne Armond,

Seretse Small, Billy Mystic and Stevie Golding; South-African born novelist, Zakes Mda; Nairobi native, M.G. Vassanji; and Wall Street Journal staff editor, Christopher John Farley.

Held since 2000, the Calabash Festival is a literary feast for writers, poets and book lovers. The event has grown over the years, with an estimated 3,500 persons attending in 2005, but its founder vowed that the intimacy of the event would not be affected by increased attendance.

"I think the idea of intimacy is very important to the Calabash experience and as we grow, we have been proactively considering ways of keeping that intimacy and even increasing it," Mr. Channer said, noting that, the "combination of music and readings, and maintaining those long breaks that we have for people to mix and mingle," have helped to maintain that familiarity.

Also contributing to the intimacy of the event is the relationship developed with the

local Treasure Beach community. "The people of Treasure Beach are great stewards and fans of the festival. They volunteer to come out to work at the festival as ushers, they help to prepare the festival area every year, they are the ones who planted the new lawn, which we had last year and will have this year," he pointed out.

Mr. Channer further noted that the community residents have benefited economically from the event, as they provide accommodation for patrons. "When it comes down to it, Calabash is fundamentally a local festival that has national, regional and international appeal and relevance," he said. Asked whether there were plans to move to a different venue as the festival continued to grow, he said, "Calabash was staying put in Treasure Beach. The environment is a crucial part of our appeal and one does not leave Eden, one has to be cast out."

will find the SuperClubs Runaway Bay GC. The par 72 course was designed by Major John Harris from Britain and opened in 1960. From the Blue Tees, the course measures a long 6,870 yards with a slope rating of 124. The combination of the wind gusting up to 35 miles per hour, long rolling fairways with large flat greens and breathtaking views of the Caribbean Sea, guarantee that golfers can expect an exhilarating experience whether they are beginners or accomplished players. The PGA-quality golf course has hosted many an international event including the MatchPlay games between the United Kingdom and the West Indies, the Jamaica Open and the World Cup of Golf Super-qualifier tournaments.

### Sandals Ocho Rios

Formerly known as Upton Golf Club, the Sandals Golf & Country Club was established in 1951 as a 9 hole course located 700 feet above sea level in Upton, a few miles east of Ocho Rios. The original 9-hole layout which, designed by P.K. Saunders, was expanded in the early 1960s to 18 holes. In June 1992, Sandals Resorts purchased the property and set about creating one of the most elite golf courses in Jamaica. The greens were rebuilt with Tidwarf Bermuda grass and the fairways resurfaced with Bermuda grass. Although comparatively

Club in 1865 and soon after the Scots invented the game of golf, a golf course was built on the site. It is situated in the middle of the town of Mandeville, the capital of Manchester and has one of the most breath-taking scenic wonders, provided by the course's 2201 foot elevation. Although it is a private members club, it is open to the public and is one of Mandeville's main tourist attractions.

environment is brilliantly incorporated in the layout. Several of the 18 tee boxes are elevated while the fairways undulate in accordance to the

topography of the craggy limestone hills. Stately Cotton and Guango trees line the fairways and guard the greens throughout the course's 6,844 yards, creating daunting natural hazards. Strategically placed bunkers and ponds also make for more challenging play. The Club, which hosted several Caribbean Championships, including the Jamaican Open, the Jamaica Classic and Shell's Wonderful World of Golf, is sloped at 123 from the Blue Tees and measures 6,844 yards.

### Constant Spring

Located in the heart of one of Kingston's nicest residential areas, Constant Spring was built in 1920 by Scottish architect Stanley Thompson, a mentor of Robert Trent Jones, making it one of Jamaica's oldest golf courses. It is a tight, short course with a breathtaking view at the 13th tee, and the challenge of driving to a narrow plateau of fairway beyond a steep valley. It has hosted all of the island's top players, many of the socially elite and more than a few concerts during its long history.

# The Jerk Story

**THE HISTORY**

The origins date back to the native Arawak Indians traditional method of using Jamaican pimento (what we call allspice) to season and smoke meat (primarily wild pigs). The escaped slaves, called Maroons, are believed to have developed and perfected this method of preserving and cooking meat during their years living in the Blue Mountains fighting the British troops. The term jerk derives from charqui, a Spanish term for jerked or dried meat.

**THE INGREDIENTS**

Jerk is spiced with three main ingredients: Scotch bonnet pepper, allspice berry (pimento berry), and thyme. Scotch bonnet peppers have an intense concentrated heat delivered to the palate with apricot or fruity overtones. The pimento berry or allspice, another key ingredient in the seasoning is a pea size berry of the pimento tree and is native to the West Indies and South America. The island of Jamaica however, stocks most of the world's supply. The spice is so named (allspice) because it tastes like a fusion of nutmeg, cloves and cinnamon, which lends jerk its most unique taste. Other spices and herbs in Jerk spice mixes can vary depending on the chef but is often made spicy and delicious with ginger, nutmeg, thyme, green onions, cinnamon and of cloves. The spices are ground in a mortar and pestle to retain the aromatic oils. This medley is rubbed into the pork, chicken or fish and then grilled over pimento wood or other sweet wood.

**THE HEALTH FACTOR**

It is widely known that grilled foods are a lot more healthy for you than those that are fried. All our meats are grilled and not fried thereby minimizing the fat intake.

Spicy cooking can have some unexpected health benefits. Peppers are the right food for people seeking a healthy, nutritious diet. Low in calories, high in Vitamins A and C, peppers are also high in a very important mineral—potassium. Capsaicin is the source of the heat in hot peppers. Some benefits of capsaicin:

- improved digestion by stimulating stomach secretions
- provide a laxative effect
- triggers the release of endorphins: When people eat hot chili the brain secretes endorphins, the opiate-like substances that block pain.
- unclogs stuffy noses by irritating mucus membranes

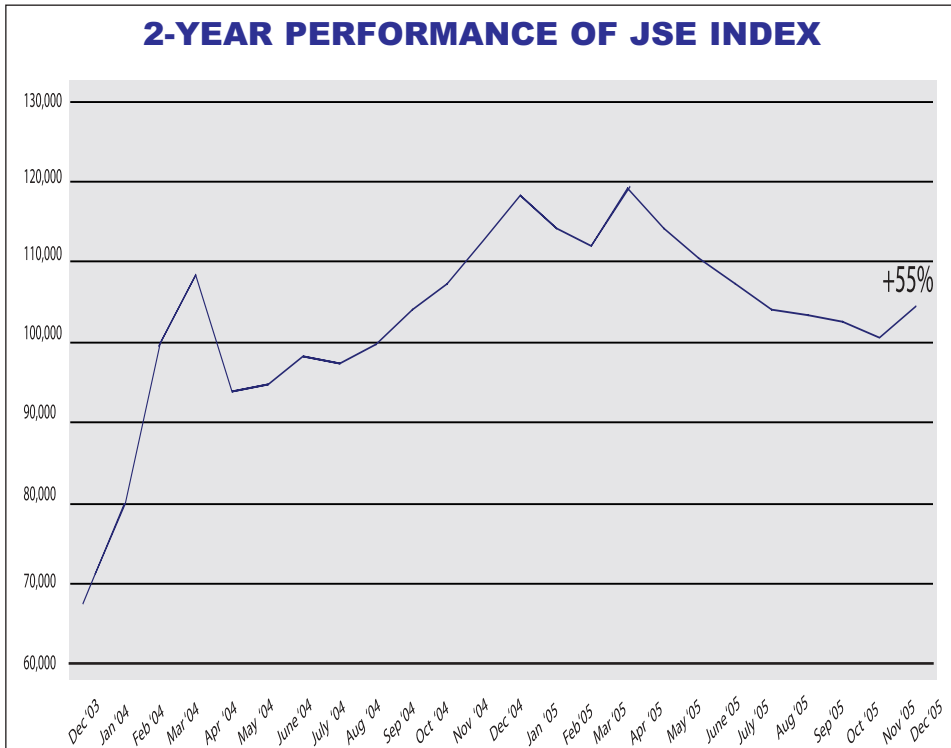

There are a number of factors involved in determining the value of gemstones. As a buyer you should be familiar with the following terms that apply to both diamonds and colored gems:

**Carat-** All gemstones are sold by weight expressed in carats. One carat equals 200 milligrams.

**Color-** Diamond color is graded across a scale from perfect colorless D to obviously colored Z. Colorless diamonds are extremely rare in nature and most will show a slight trace of color- often imperceptible to the naked eye. In the case of colored gemstones the more pure and intense the color, the more valuable the stone. Stones with even color saturation are valued at a premium.

**Clarity-** Inclusions are visible objects within a gemstone that are not part of its original crystal structure. In the case of diamonds, even the smallest inclusion can lower its value. In colored gemstones, however, small inclusions are common and will not significantly affect value provided they do not interfere with the passage of light through the stone.

**Cut-** This refers to the shape and proportions of the stone. Diamonds and colored gems should be cut in a manner to accentuate the stone's color and clarity.

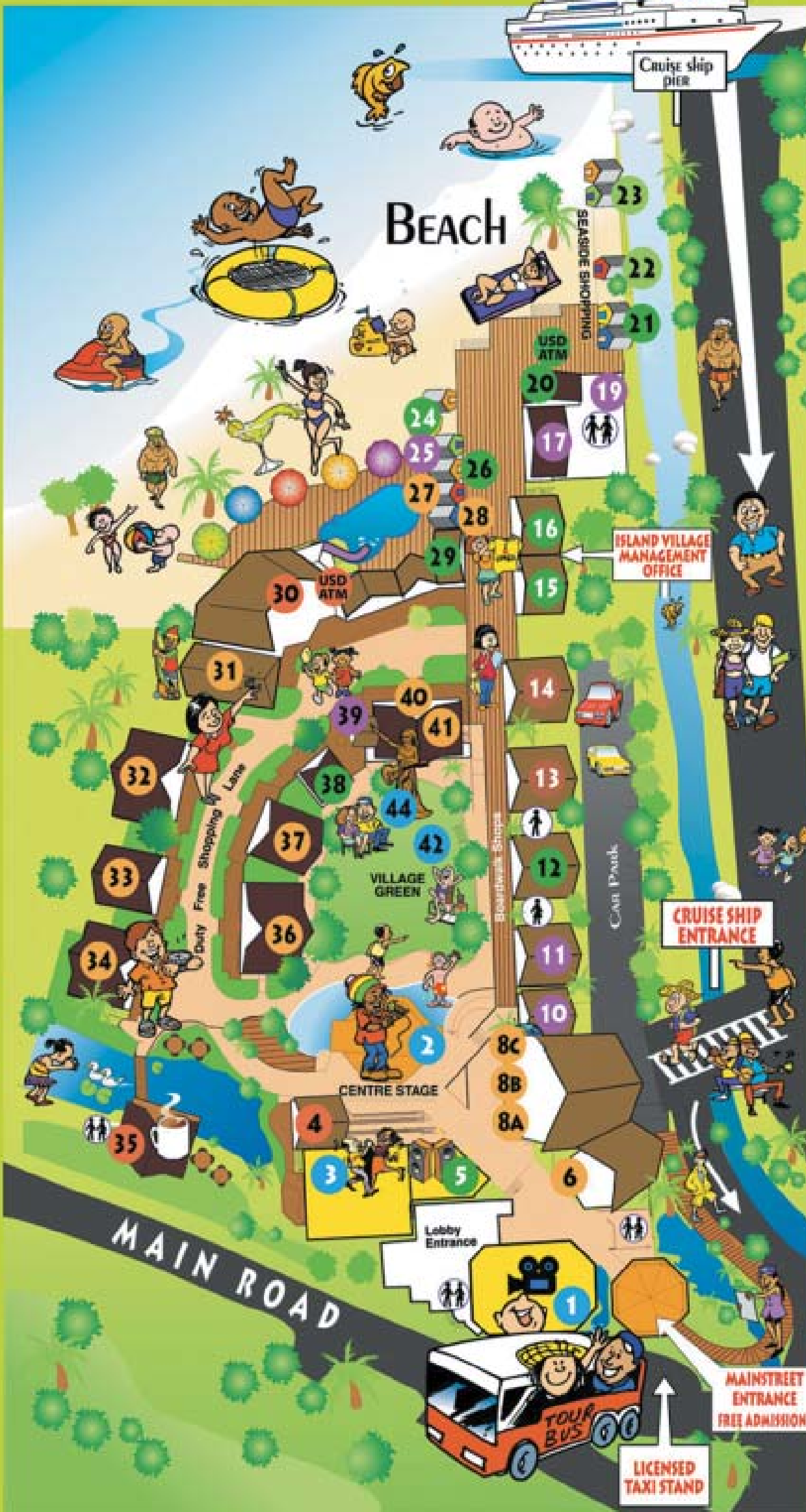

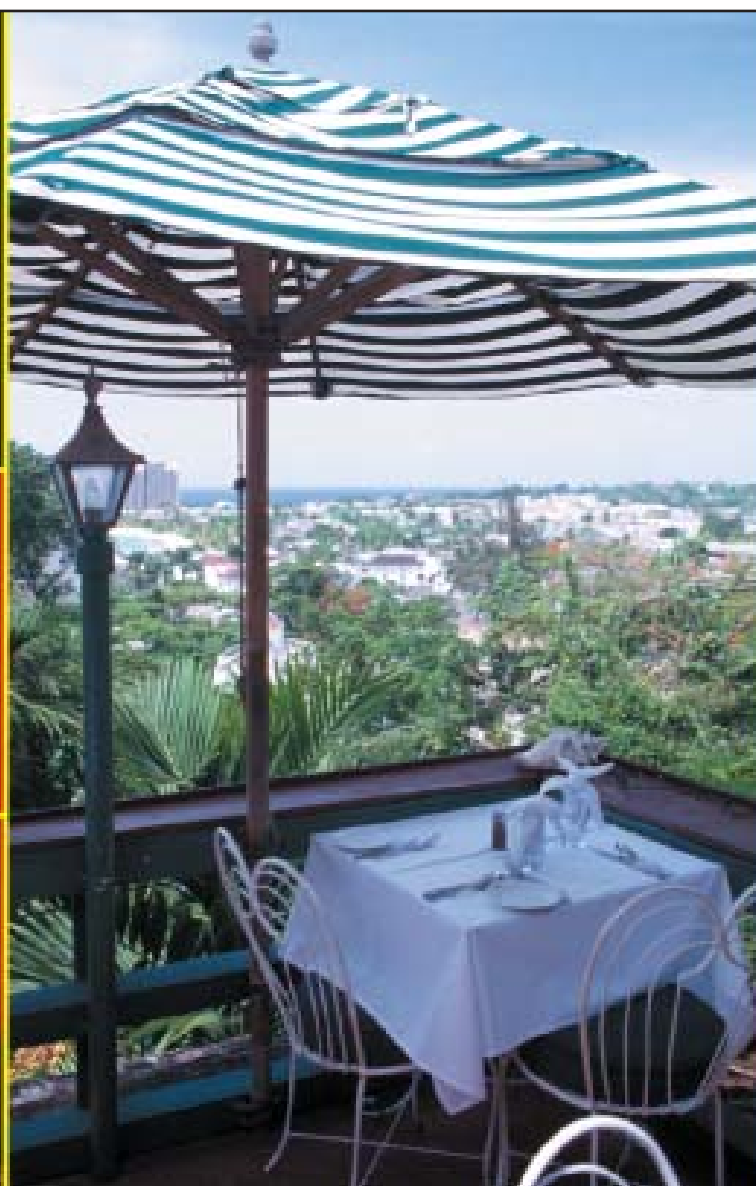

These percentages apply to the entire staff, not to each individual staff member. In each villa, you will find a gratuity guide advising you how tips should be distributed among your staff members based on their seniority- in some cases you can pay the entire amount to the head of house or directly to the property manager for distribution.
